Nationally known poverty expert Dr. Donna Beegle will give participants a comprehensive understanding of the context, worldview, learning challenges and communication styles of families living in poverty, as essential components in breaking the cycle of generational poverty. and answered — include: What does living in poverty teach? What does it mean to be poor in wealthy America? How do income, educational opportunities and life experiences shape our communication styles? What can we do to prevent misunderstandings and missed opportunities for connection?

A highly experienced national public speaker, discussion leader, trainer and the author of “See Poverty, Be The Difference,” Donna has worked and written articles providing insights and strategies for communicating more effectively across race, class, gender and generational barriers for 17 years.

Donna’s inspiring story and work have been featured in newspapers around the nation, on local TV and on national programs such as PBS. Her work will be featured in an upcoming PBS documentary titled “Invisible Nation.”
