City honors congregation for involvement in civic projects

The Sisters of St. Joseph led off this year's Fall Fest Parade as Grand Marshals of the annual Concordia event. The honor by the Fall Fest committee recognized the sisters for our work in establishing the Neighbor to Neighbor center in downtown Concordia and for leadership in the Year of Peace effort, which kicked off at last year's Fall Fest. Year of Peace events have included a film series in collaboration with Cloud County Community College, a city-wide "Civility Pledge" campaign, a weekly newspaper column written by a wide range of Concordia residents and

book studies and workshops. About a dozen sisters rode the "We Love U Concordia" float during the parade through downtown Concordia Sept. 25, while several others walked along side. Still other sisters and Motherhouse employees took spots along the parade route to cheer them on. Neighbor to Neighbor also had a Fall Fest booth to sell a variety of handmade items, including Christmas tree angels made by women who have visited the center at 103 E. Sixth St. Also available for sale were "Heavenly Bits" dog biscuits, which are made by sisters to help support the center.
